


Find Your Ring Size

Printing Instructions


1. To obtain accurate measurements, please download this PDF to your computer and print this document at a page size of 100 percent.
2. Verify the page scale setting prior to printing by checking your printer dialog box. Under the page scaling option, select "none" or uncheck the box for page scaling.
3. Compare a ruler or U.S. Quarter with the guides on the right to ensure your printed document is the correct size. The marks of the ruler should match precisely and the U.S. Quarter should completely fill the circle shape.



If you have a ring that fits

Use the ring that fits comfortably and has a similar width band to the one you would like to purchase.


1. Place your ring over the circles below.
2. Match the **inside** of your ring to the circle closest in size.
3. If your ring falls between two sizes, we recommend selecting the larger size.



If you don't have a ring that fits

1. Find a piece of non-stretchy string about 6" long, or a strip of paper about 6" long and 1/4" wide.
2. Wrap it snugly around the base of your finger.
3. Using a pen, mark the point on the string or paper where it overlaps, forming a complete circle.
4. Compare the length of the string or paper to the lines on the paper here to determine your ring size. If you are between sizes, we recommend selecting the larger size.

If your ring has a wide band (1/4" or wider) consider going a half size larger than your normal ring size.
